The primary relationship of work, expression, manifestation, and item; 2. Responsibility entities, such as person and corporate body; 3. Subject entities, such as concept, object, event, and place. The three groups are analyzed in relation to the generic tasks of finding, identifying, selecting and obtaining access to materials. The first group of entities seems innovative as describing the hierarchical relationships that cluster bibliographic items into manifestations, expressions and works.
